



BACKGROUND

The State of Utah has unique tax laws that were first passed in 1985 titled Truth-in-Taxation or TnT.

In short, these tax laws made it so in
Utah, agencies are not allowed to
collect more revenue than a
previous year on the existing
homes.

Taxing agencies only get additional revenue by applying the existing tax rate to new growth.

HOW UTAH PROPERTY TAX WORKS

New growth drives all revenue for taxing entities in Utah.

If there wasn't one new home built or renovation done in Utah County last year, County Government would receive exactly the same dollar amount in property taxes REGARDLESS of how much your home value changed.

However, inflation persists.





Statement on Utah County's Proposed Tax Increase

After examining the budget proposal from the Utah County Commission for 2020 and studying the history of property tax rates and spending for the last several decades in the county, the Utah Taxpayers Association believes that an adjustment in the certified rate is appropriate. That being said, we do not agree that a 100% increase in the tax rate is needed.

Due to a lack of foresight for decades by previous members of the Commission, Utah County has only once in 33 years taken steps to restore purchasing power in their property tax revenue. That was done 23 years ago. That failure to act has now put the county at a tipping point. The Utah Taxpayers Association often supports taxing entities going through the Truth-in-Taxation process from time to time to recapture inflation by publicly making their case to taxpayers.








SO WHY DO MY TAXES GO UP?

There's a couple reasons

- One of the taxing entities you live in (School District, City, Water District, County) goes through this Truth-in-Taxation process and formalizes a rate higher than what is calculated.
- 2. Your home value increased more than the average of all other homes in the taxing district.

MARILYN HUNT (American Fork Resident) EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT PAYING SCHOOL TAXES WHEN REACHING AGE OF 65 AND REQUESTS FOR CONSIDERATION OF SENIOR CITIZENS.

OLIVE HAUPT (Springville Resident) REQUESTS TO PUT A CAP ON SENIOR CITIZENS HOUSE TAXES, WAGES DON'T INCREASE AND DOES NOT WANT AN ABATEMENT.

JAMES HAUPT (Springville Resident) COULD QUALIFY FOR AN ABATEMENT BUT DOES NOT WANT AN ABATEMENT. PROVIDED A BUS ANALOGY, LOGIC OF BEING CHARGED MORE FOR THE MORE PEOPLE MOVING IN, RATHER THAN THE PRICE DECREASING WITH THE AMOUNT OF PEOPLE SHARING THE COST.

GREG DOURDAN (Orem Resident) HAS A RESOLUTION PETITION THAT HAS A COUPLE HUNDRED OF NAMES, TO SUSPEND PAY RAISES OF 23/24 FOR ALL ELECTED OFFICIALS IN LIEU OF THE PROPOSED 47.9% INCREASE AND FURTHER COST CUTTING BE UNDERTAKEN BY ALL ELECTED OFFICIALS UNTIL THE DEFICIT IS CLEARED.

CRAIG CARSON (Highland Resident) CONCERNED HE DIDN'T QUALIFY FOR TAX RELIEF. DOESN'T WANT TO SELL HIS HOUSE BECAUSE HE CAN'T PAY THE TAXES.
